Inner-City Scholarship Fund students are experiencing a transformative year, thanks to the unwavering support of our community. Beyond the classroom, these young scholars explored the possibility of diverse career paths in law, medicine, finance, and more.

One of the highlights was a visit to American Express headquarters, hosted by CEO and Chairman, Stephen J. Squeri. High school students from St. Jean Baptiste and Cardinal Hayes gained invaluable insights into the business world through sessions with the company's corporate archivist and the head of their US internship program. The morning culminated with an intimate and friendly Q&A with Mr. Squeri where he generously shared the story of his professional journey and his keys to success.

Twenty-eight Jimmy Lee Scholars from Catholic high schools across the Archdiocese of New York had the unique opportunity to spend a day at the Hospital for Special Surgery. Under the guidance of experienced healthcare professionals, they engaged in hands-on learning in the field of orthopedic surgery. Activities included



practicing casting techniques, intubation simulations, suturing, and bone drilling.

Nine scholars attended the prestigious 79th Annual Alfred E. Smith Memorial Dinner, expanding their horizons and building valuable connections. The Hon. William C. Conner Inn of Court gave 22 students the chance to participate in a mock trial, providing them with a window into the legal profession. Inner-City's annual Job Opportunities Program also played a crucial role, equipping students with essential skills and knowledge for their future careers.

These invaluable experiences, made possible by the generous support of individuals and organizations, empower Inner-City Scholarship Fund students and broaden their understanding of the diverse career paths available to them.

47th Annual Awards Dinner

Inner-City Scholarship Fund successfully raised over \$1.55 million at the 47th Annual Awards Dinner held on December 3rd at the Plaza Hotel in Manhattan. The event honored Stephen J. Squeri, CEO and Chairman of American Express.

This year's dinner began with an enthusiastic performance by the choir of Good Shepherd School that got everyone in the holiday spirit. His Eminence, Timothy Michael Cardinal Dolan, Archbishop of New York, and Peter T. Grauer, Chairman of Bloomberg L.P. and President of Inner-City Scholarship Fund, presented the 2024 Inner-City Scholarship Fund Award to Mr. Squeri in recognition of his outstanding contributions to Catholic education.

Mr. Squeri expressed deep gratitude for the award, noting that it held significant personal meaning for him as a product of Catholic education. "(My parents) believed that by going to a Catholic institution, the whole person would be educated—spiritually, physically, emotionally, and intellectually. They believed a Catholic education would provide you with the tools to be successful in life, that it would provide you the discipline for learning."

Mr. Squeri went on to explain why supporting Inner-City made all the attendees' heroes in his eyes. "Through your generosity, you have given (the students) the tools to be successful in life.... Maybe they will not become CEO, but they will have the foundation now to become successful. They have

the ability to change the course of their families' lives. That is a gift that is extraordinary which is what Inner-City does."

We were privileged to hear from Rick Cordero, a 2024 La Salle Academy graduate and former Inner-City Scholarship Fund recipient. Rick spoke about how he has used the tools his scholarship gave him to shape his own success. Rick is now a freshman at Manhattan University, where Mr. Squeri serves as the Chairman of the Board of Trustees. Rick told us the scholarship empowered him to excel academically. "Thanks to the support of my sponsors, I didn't have to navigate my education alone. Your generosity has helped thousands of students feel more secure, encouraged, focused, and confident in reaching their potential."

We concluded the program with a lively performance by Pro Players, The Group. The choir features a roster of former NFL players, including Super Bowl champions, Pro Bowlers, NFL Men of the Year, and Pro Football Hall of Fame inductees. Their talents extend far beyond the field and they provided an energetic and inspiring end to the evening.






Imani tells us she "honestly can't wait to provide the same benefits of a scholarship to a young student who looks just like me one day."
